



***IF ADD \$3 BILLION TO HEAD START/EARLY HEAD START IN THE STIMULUS:***

Using the formula under the Act,

**Estimated Increase of 162,593 New Slots for Children and Pregnant Women**

These new slots would be broken out as follows:

- Increase in Head Start (Regions 1-10) Slots Except for Guam, American Samoa, Mariana Islands, Virgin Islands, and Palau Slots Post-FY 2008 Expansion: 94,249
- Increase in Head Start (Regions 1-10) Slots for Guam, American Samoa, Mariana Islands, Virgin Islands, and Palau Post-FY 2008 Expansion: 683
- Increase in Early Head Start (Regions 1-11) Slots Post-FY 2008 Expansion: 65,220
- Increase in American Indian/Alaskan Native Head Start Slots Under Special Expansion Provisions Post-FY 2008 Expansion: 1,210
- Increase in Seasonal and Migrant Head Start Slots Under Special Expansion Provisions Post-FY 2008 Expansion: 1,231

**80,280 in New Jobs for Only 1 year unless this \$3 billion increase is made permanent.**

\$ 3 billion MINUS \$3,410,000 in increased monitoring expenses MINUS \$328,235,119 in COLA MINUS \$100,000,000 in state early learning council expenses EQUALS \$2,568,354,881

\$2,568,354,881 is equivalent to 80,280 new jobs if using the ratio of \$1 billion to 31,250 new jobs which according to the 2006-2007 PIR is the current ratio of federal funding to Head Start teacher and staff jobs.

***IF ADD \$3 BILLION TO CHILD CARE & DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT***

**Serve an additional 482,684 children**

Calculation is after inflation so that we don't lose children we served in 2009

A new investment of \$3 billion for child care subsidies will serve an additional 482,684 children and create *paid work* for an estimated 189,600 caregivers.
